Private Sector Jobs Recovery

March 2000 (Peak) = 4.846 million jobs
 Best Case Recovery: June 2017 (4 month gain)
 Likely Recovery: Early 2020s

Private Sector Job Losses Jan 2000-Feb 2011

OH: -537,500 | Rank: 2 – only MI worse at -696,700)

Private Sector Job Growth % Change

1990-2000: 17% | Rank: 37
 Jan 2000-Feb 2011: -11.1% | Rank: 50 – only MI worse at -17.5%
 1990-Feb 2011: 4.3% | Rank: 46 – only CT (-3.8%), RI (0.1%), MI (0.3%), NJ (3%) & NY (4%) worse

Net Private Sector Jobs vs. Net Government Jobs

1990-Feb 2011: 176,900 vs. 63,400, Private Sector Jobs to Government Jobs Ratio of 2.79
 Rank: 44 – CT (-1.6%), RI (-0.3%), NJ (1.8%), NC (2.5%), HI (2.5%), VT (2.5%), & MO (2.6%) worse

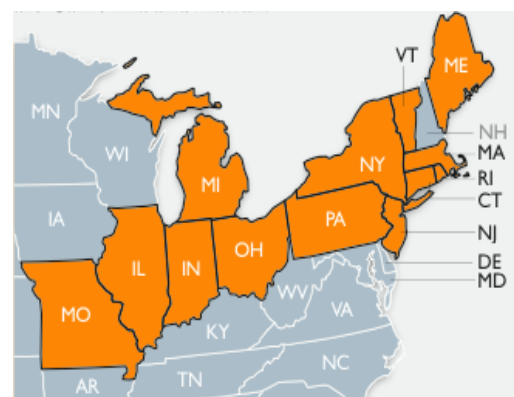
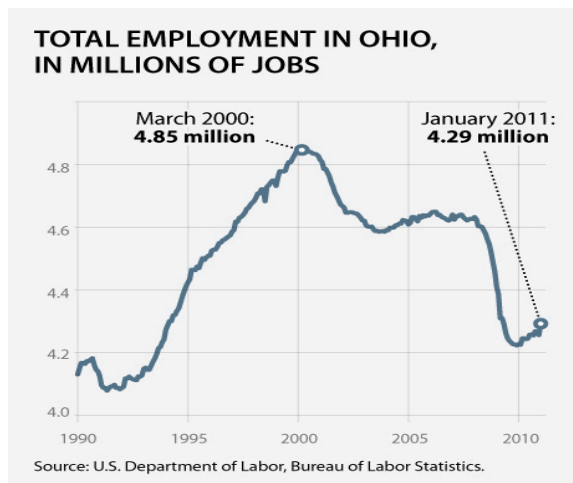

 Population & Net Job Gain 1990-2010 (people per job): 183,843,395 & 5,623,100 (33) vs. 124,290,420 & 10,068,300 (12)

1990-2000: 16% Forced Unionization vs. 31% Worker Freedom
 2000-2011: -4% Forced Unionization vs. 2% Worker Freedom
 1990-2011: 11% Forced Unionization vs. 34% Worker Freedom
 Top 5: NV: 78.8%; UT: 74.7%; ID: 65.9%; AZ: 63%, ND: 56.7%
 Forced Unionization Bottom 15: states highlighted on map, plus California and Hawaii
 Federal Unemployment Fund Debt: \$32.24 billion Forced Unionization vs. \$9.32 billion Worker Freedom
