OCCUPATIONAL LICENSING REFORM IN OHIO

Ohio continues to curb bureaucratic and cumbersome occupational licensing requirements that too often burden job seekers while doing little to improve public safety.1 Excessive licensing rules make it especially difficult for middle-aged and lower-income workers without college degrees to enter licensed professions.² The Ohio General Assembly, following several of The Buckeve Institute's recommendations, has relaxed some unnecessary, onerous requirements, and Ohio now recognizes many professional licenses issued by other states.³

That progress, however, fails to address underlying requirements for some licenses and continuing education provisions that hinder workers more than they benefit the public. Ohio licenses auctioneers, for example, even though nearly half of the country does not, with no apparent adverse effects.4 Simple bonding protocols would seem sufficient to safeguard consumers without imposing the additional costs of attaining and enforcing licenses. Similarly, Ohio mandates licensure for home bakeries and families selling raw milk. Health and safety are their normal justifications, but research shows that such concerns are overblown and an inexpensive label requirement would assuage any legitimate risk. Small entrepreneurs using their kitchens or homesteads to raise some extra cash cannot afford the byzantine licensing requirements and entrepreneurial ventures end before they even begin.⁵ And finally, Ohio requires 1,500 hours of training for a cosmetology license—more hours than most states, and a disproportionate burden on lower-income and minority workers looking to enter the profession.⁶

The 132nd Ohio General Assembly took aim at problems like these and enacted the most comprehensive occupational licensing reform legislation in the nation.⁷ Senate Bill 255 requires Ohio licensing boards to justify the financial and regulatory burdens they place on license holders. The legislation gave every state board and licensing agency a 6-year term, with an automatic sunset provision requiring reauthorization by the General Assembly or an end of operations. In *Opening Doors and Opening Doors II*, The Buckeye Institute examined the licenses scheduled for review by legislative committees, and recommended eliminating or reducing licensing regulations, fees, and education requirements that disadvantage Ohio.⁸ *Opening Doors III* recommends eliminating another 27 license- or certification-requirements and reducing burdens imposed by another 20. Following these recommendations will better align Ohio standards with those in Indiana, Kentucky, Michigan, Pennsylvania, and West Virginia.⁹ But even more is required. Several committee review cycles have shown the need for several overarching reforms to improve the review process and lighten licensing burdens. These include:

- 1) Expanding the statutory definition of "occupational license" Many business licenses, registrations, and certifications do not meet the current definition and evade committee review. A broader definition would clarify ambiguities and bring more bureaucratic requirements under legislative oversight.
- 2) Keeping continuing education requirements limited and focused Continuing education (CE) requirements are important for ensuring licensees stay up to date on relevant information and training. But time-consuming CE requirements can burden busy professionals and therefore should be tailored to focus on new occupational and public safety information. The General Assembly should prohibit extraneous topics like "Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion" from being shoehorned into CE mandates, and should prescribe essential health and safety CE requirements instead.
- 3) Moving toward inspections and bonding requirements The General Assembly should eventually reduce the global burdens of licensure by moving towards inspections and bonding requirements rather than mandating individual occupational licenses.¹⁰
